## A Visit with the Pastor . . .

The deacons serve as counselors and ministry partners to me, and I'm indebted to them for their assistance. In our June meeting I shared two visions with them, the first of those I'd like to explain here.

It's inarguable that the 2020 pandemic affected every church. For the first time in our lives we were forbidden to gather for study and worship. I remember Clark Boyd and Greg Sims meeting with me urgently and regularly to determine how to respond to this mandate. Nothing I've ever seen in churches produced as much disagreement as distancing, masks and vaccines.

Thom Rainer, formerly of LifeWay Christian Publishing, reported a sobering loss in weekly Bible study in Southern Baptist life due to Covid nearly a 28 percent decrease in weekly Sunday School between 2019 and 2022.



This was also our first attempt at broadcasting. I remember some of those first recordings from the pastor's office and laptop since I was the only one present on Sunday morning. Jim Hancock and Clif Culpepper helped us get more proficient. Now we have good equipment and broadcast every Sunday.

It's time to press forward in obedience to God.

For the "Pastor's Prayer Partners," I'll ask all who are willing to commit to prayer with a group of three ("prayer triplets") for six weeks this fall. These groups will pray each week for specific needs, and will pray at a time and place of their choosing. The church is available of course, but groups can meet wherever they'd like and at a time they like. Jesus prayed before daybreak and Paul and Silas prayed at midnight, so the time of prayer isn't important. This is a group decision.
