## A Visit with the Pastor . . .

I met an adult editor from LifeWay at Shocco Springs Baptist Assembly several years ago who has been kind to invite me to write a few times for him. He superintends "Bible Studies for Life," though our adults study "Explore the Bible." Nevertheless, writing for LifeWay is a great discipline since one has to study to understand scripture and then try to make the application plain—just like every teacher and preacher must.

He has also invited me several times to do appraisal readings – read either the lesson or the teacher's commentary and look for better ways to communicate. The materials presented are anonymous, so the appraiser doesn't know who the writers are. He first explained this to me in a unique way, asking me to "see if there's anything bone-headed in the lessons."

The only "bone-headed" thing I've found, other than a few grammar issues, is a writer using the



phrase, "When Jesus was alive, he did thus and so." Of course, I suggested rephrasing to, "When Jesus walked on earth, he did thus and so."

But I've been thinking about the bone-headed things I've said over the years without having the benefit of an appraiser.

I have sermon notes from 30 years ago. Back in the day we didn't have external hard drives or OneDrive, so I laboriously typed notes on my Smith Corona Galaxy 12 portable and filed them. I'm ashamed that my understanding was so limited and that I apparently spoke a number of "bone-headed" things. I'm feeling the leading of the Lord to have a bonfire just like the pagan magicians did in Ephesus and get rid of those old sermons. Fortunately, there was no livestream in those early years!
